The number of courses and subject matter are contingent upon the needs of the school, funding, and sufficient enrollment. Faculty Associate positions are limited to teaching one to two courses per semester. Faculty Associate positions are part-time and non-benefits-eligible. Specific start date within the 2020-21 Academic Year will vary based on assigned courses.

- A Ph.D. in **Human Communication** (not mass or media) by the time of appointment
- Demonstrated teaching effectiveness in human communication courses at the university level
- Experience teaching human communication courses in an online environment

- Experience in teaching Communication Theory/Method; Interpersonal Communication (*specifically Conflict and/or Negotiation*); Organizational Communication (*specifically Workplace Communication & Training and Development*); and/or Strategic/Crisis and Persuasive Communication
- Experience with online curriculum development and design
- Experience overseeing the work of Graders/Teaching Assistants

- Demonstrated understanding of goals and trajectory of online MA in Communication
- Demonstrated success meeting the needs of diverse student populations and/or reaching out to diverse communities, while fostering an inclusive environment
